13.—COUNTY OF PERTH.

I,-COUNTY BOUNDARIES.

The county of Perth had four detached parts, viz.:—(a.) The parishes of Culross and Tulliallan, adjoining the counties of Fife and Kinross; (b.) Part of the parish of Kippen, surrounded by the county of Stirling; and (c.) and (d.) Two detached parts of the parish of Caputh, each surrounded by the county of Forfar. It contained two detached parts of other counties, viz., part of the county of Forfar, consisting of a detached part of the parish of Kettins, and part of the county of Stirling, consisting of part of the parish of Logie. There were twelve parishes situated partly in the county of Perth and partly in other counties, viz., Abernethy, Alloa, Alyth, Arngask, Caputh, Coupar-Angus, Forgandenny, Fossoway & Tulliebole, Kippen, Lecropt, Liff Benvie & Invergowrie, and Logie. It was also found necessary to deal with the parish of Fowlis-Easter, which is for certain purposes united to the Forfarshire parish of Lundie.

The county boundaries have been dealt with as follows:-

A. With the County of Clackmannan.

1.—Alloa.

A very small portion of the parish of Alloa was situated in Perthshire, the rest of the parish being in the county of Clackmannan. It extended to about 3 acres, was situated at Gogar Haugh, and is the property of Mrs. Morries Stirling. By the Order printed at p. 50 no change was made in the county boundary, but this small portion of Alloa was transferred to the parish of Logic and to the county of Stirling. See County of Stirling, Logic, infra, p. 276.

B. With the County of Fife.

1.—ABERNETHY.

The parish of Abernethy was situated partly in the county of Fife and partly in the county of Perth. The division of the parish between these two counties was correctly shown on the Ordnance Survey maps, with this exception, that the lands of Easter Colzie, in the south-east corner of the parish, should have been shown as part of the county of Fife. By the Order printed at p. 46 the whole of the parish, except the lands of Easter Colzie, Nochnarrie, and Pitlour, were transferred to the county of Perth. These excepted lands remain in the county of Fife, being transferred to Fife parishes, Easter Colzie to Newburgh, and Nochnarrie and Pitlour to Strathmiglo. 1.—Alyth.

The parish of Alyth was situated partly in the county of Forfar and partly in the county of Perth. By the Order printed at p. 45 it has been placed wholly in the county of Perth.

2.--CAPUTH.

In adjusting the boundaries between Forfarshire and Perthshire it was necessary to deal with three of the eight detached parts of the parish of Caputh. The whole of the parish except these three detached parts was situated in the main portion of the county of Perth. One of these three detached parts formed part of the county of Forfar. It was situated at Balbeuchly, and has been annexed to the parish of Auchterhouse (see County of Forfar, Auchterhouse, &c., supra, p. 192). The remaining two of these three detached parts were also detached parts of the county of Perth. The one was situated at Foffarty, and has been transferred to the county of Forfar and to the parish of Kinnettles. The other was situated at Broughty Castle, and has been transferred to the county of Forfar, and to the parish of Monifieth (see County of Forfar, Caputh, supra, p. 188).

3.—Coupab-Angus.

The parish of Coupar-Angus was situated partly in the county of Porfar and partly in the county of Perth. By the Order printed at

p. 37 it has been placed wholly in the county of Perth.

The subjects thus transferred are for the most part situated in the police burgh of Coupar-Aneus. The county boundary previously ran through the town. It now follows the eastern boundary of the parish of Coupar-Angus, and accordingly all subjects in the town of Coupar-Angus are now placed within the county of Perth. It would serve no good purpose to enumerate the various small properties and their proprietors. The following subjects have been transferred from the county of Forfar to the county of Perth:—

5.—Kettins.

The parish of Kettins had a detached part which was also a detached part of the county of Forfar. It was situated at Bandirran, and adjoined the Perthshire parishes of Collace, Kinnaird, and St. Martins, and a detached part of Caputh. By the Order printed at p. 38 this detached part has been transferred to the parish of Collace and to the county of Perth.

2.—Forgandenny and Forteviot.

The parish of Forgandenny was situated partly in the county of Kinross and partly in the county of Perth. By the Order printed at p. 47 the Kinross-shire part was transferred to Perthshire, and it was at the same time transferred to the parish of Forteviot. E. With the County of Stirling.

1.—ALLOA.

A small part of the parish of Alloa was situated in the county of Perth, adjoining the Perthshire part of the parish of Logie. By the Order printed at p. 50 it has been transferred to the county of Stirling and to the parish of Logie. See County of Stirling, Logie, infra, p. 278, or County of Clackmannan, Alloa, infra, p. 271.

2,-Kippen.

The parish of Kippen was situated partly in the county of Perth and partly in the county of Stirling. A portion of the Perthshire part of the parish was also a detached part of Perthshire. The whole parish has now been placed in the county of Stirling by the Order printed at p. 52.

3.—Lecropt.

The parish of Lecropt was situated partly in the county of Perth and partly in the county of Stirling. By the Order printed at p. 51 that part of the parish which lay to the east of the west boundary of the Scottish Central Bailway line was transferred to the parish of Legie. At the same time a small part of the parish of Logie which lay to the west of the west boundary of that railway, and on the right bank of the Allan Water, was transferred to the parish of Lecropt. Then the parish of Lecropt, as thus altered in area, was placed wholly in the county of Perth.

The following subjects were thus transferred from the county of Stirling to the county of Perth :—

LOGIE.

The parish of Logie was situated partly in the county of Clackmannan, partly in the county of Perth, and partly in the county of Stirling. Part of the Clackmannanshire portion formed a detached portion of that county. The effect of the Order which deals with this parish (printed at p. 50) may be described in general terms as follows:—The area of the parish has been altered (1) by the disjunction of the portions attached to the main portion of the county of Clackmannan, and of the small portion already noticed (Lecropt, supra) as having been transferred to the parish of Lecropt; and (2) by the addition of the Perthshire part of Alloa parish and of the portion of Lecropt parish east of the west boundary of the Scottish Central Railway line. The parish, as thus altered in area, has been placed wholly in the county of Stirling.

II.—PARISH BOUNDARIES.

The boundaries of the Perthshire parishes were unusually complicated, and presented problems of great difficulty and complexity. Owing to the manner in which parishes were entaugled with each other, it is necessary to deal with them for the most part in groups, with the view of securing that the changes on each parish shall be detailed in one group. This is possible in the case of all parishes except two, viz., the parish of Caputh, of which detached parts were scattered without the slightest regard to geographical convenience, and the parish of Dunkeld & Dowally, one detached part of which will be dealt with in a different group from that in which the main portion of the parish is placed. In all cases the usual cross references are given.

1.—ABERNETHY.

The parish of Abernethy has been altered in area through the transference of certain parts of the parish which were formerly in Fife to the Fife parishes of Newburgh and Strathmiglo by the Order printed at p. 46.

2.—Auchterarder and Dunning.

Each of these parishes had a small detached part, there being, however, this peculiarity that the detached part of Dunning was separated from the main portion of Dunning only by the detached part of Auchterarder. By the Order printed at p. 53 the detached part of Auchterarder was transferred to Dunning, and thus the detached

part of Dunning has been united to the main portion of the parish. The detached part of Auchterarder lay in the north-west corner of Dunning parish. The area thus transferred from the parish of Auchterarder to the parish of Dunning was—

9.- Dron and Dunbarney.

The parish of Dron had a detached part lying to the west of the main portion of the parish, and separated from it by a narrow intervening strip of the parish of Dunbarney. By the Order printed at p. 72 the greater portion of this intervening strip was annexed to Dron, and the detached part of Dron has in this way been united with the main portion of the parish.



The following subject has thus been transferred from the parish of Dunbarney to the parish of Dron :--

10.-Forgandenny and Forteviot.

The parish of Forteviot had two detached parts. Forteviot detached No. 1 was situated at Whitehill, and lay on the south-east side of the parish of Forgandenny. Forteviot detached No. 2 was situated at Hilton Junetion, and lay on the north side of Forgandenny. As already explained (supra, p. 204) the parish of Forgandenny was situated partly in the county of Kinross and partly in the county of Perth. By the Order printed at p. 47 the following changes were effected:—(a.) Forteviot detached No. 2 was annexed to Forgandenny; and (b.) so much of Forgandenny as lay south-west of the River May was annexed to the parish of Forteviot, the main portion of Forteviot being thus united with Forteviot detached No. 1. The portion of Forgandenny thus transferred includes the portion formerly in Kinross-shire, but the Order provides that this district shall be transferred to Perthshire.

11.—KILMADOCK AND KINCARDINE.

Part of the parish of Kincardine situated at Thornhill was separated from the main portion of the parish by the seuthern part of the parish of Kilmadoek. By the Order printed at p. 73 an exchange of territory was effected between these two parishes. Part of the detached part and part of the main portion of Kincardine were given to Kilmadock, and the remainder of the detached part was united to the main portion of Kincardine by the annexation to Kincardine of a small intervening part of Kilmadock. Clause I. of the Order describes the portion of Kilmadock given to Kincardine. The line can be readily followed when it is explained that the starting-point lies north-east of Ramoth. The line described in Clause II. runs along the road which leads from Bridge of Teith south-west to Ramoth. The line described in Clause III. can be laid down approximately on the one-inch maps from the description.

12. - Lecropt.

The parish of Lecropt was situated partly in the county of Perth and partly in the county of Stirling. The parish has now been placed wholly in the county of Perth, but its area is altered somewhat. Under the Order printed at p. 51, (1) it received the addition of a small portion of the parish of Logic lying west of the Scottish Central Railway line, and (2) there was transferred to the parish of Logic all that part of the Stirlingshire portion of Lecropt which lay to the east of the west boundary of the railway.

For particulars as to the changes thus effected, see Lecropt, supra, p. 205, and County of Stirling, Logie, infra, p. 280.

13.—Perth and Tibbernore,

The parish of Tibbermore had two detached parts, both of which were wholly surrounded by the parish of Perth. Tibbermore detached No. 2, situated at York Place, Perth, was situated wholly within the parliamentary and municipal boundary of the burgh of Perth, and the greater portion of Tibbermore detached No. 1 was also situated within the same boundary. The effect of the Order printed at p. 74 is to transfer to the parish of Perth the whole of Tibbermore detached No. 1 and so much of Tibbermore detached No. 2 as lies within the municipal boundaries of the burgh of Perth, and to transfer to the parish of Tibbermore that part of Perth parish which lay north of the Scouring Burn and west and north of the west and north burgh boundaries.

The following subjects are affected :-

 Transferred from the parish of Tibbermore to the parish of Perth.

The subjects are too numerous to particularise, but they consist of all those subjects in the parish of Tibbermore which are entered in the valuation roll of the city of Perth for the year 1890-91. These include, inter alia, the greater part of the lands of Tullylumb, belonging to the Glovers Incorporation of Perth, but it must be noted that part of these lands (part of Over Tullylumb and Wellshill) remains in Tibbermore, being cutside the burgh parliamentary boundary.

EXPLANATORY NOTES.

- The Counties are arranged in the same order as in the Census returns, "so
 that a zig-zag line beginning at the north of Scotland and carried to the south
 passes successively through every County." The Counties have the same numbers
 as in the Census returns.
- 2. The subjects transferred are enumerated under the head of the County or Parish to which they are transferred. Thus when an area has been transferred from County A to County B, the subjects affected are enumerated under County B, and a cross reference is given under County A.
- 3. The names of subjects are those contained in the Valuation Rolls. In the description of subjects the term "farm" includes the farm-house and servants' houses, and the term "croft" includes the house. But where any of the servants' houses on a farm have distinctive names, such houses are detailed separately. "House" includes cottage, and "land" includes gardens, yards, &c.
- 4. The names of proprietors are in almost every case those given in the Valuation Rolls of 1890-91. It is therefore to be borne in mind that in some cases those who are described as proprietors may be limited owners only, such as liferenters or leaseholders.
- 5. Where villages or towns are affected, the names of the subjects and the proprietors are not usually given. The description of the area transferred is in such cases quite sufficient to show whether and to what extent any subject in the village or town has been affected by the Order.
- 6. The Ordnance maps referred to are those published by the Ordnance Survey Department on the scale of one inch to the mile. Those published down to this date (November 1891), show the Counties and Parishes as they were before the Orders of the Commissioners came into operation. It is expected that, when the work of the Commissioners is completed, revised maps will be published to show the altered boundaries, but the sheets of the revised maps will bear the same numbers as the present maps. The Orders and the explanations can be readily followed on the maps as published at present.
- 7. An ampersand (&) is used where a County or a Parish has a double name, e.g., "Ross & Cromarty", "Fetlar & North Yell."
- In most cases it is necessary to read the text of the Order along with the explanation, because the full descriptions contained in the Orders are, as a rule, not repeated in the explanation.
